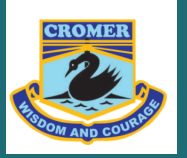


Stage 2 Newsletter

This term we will be concentrating on:

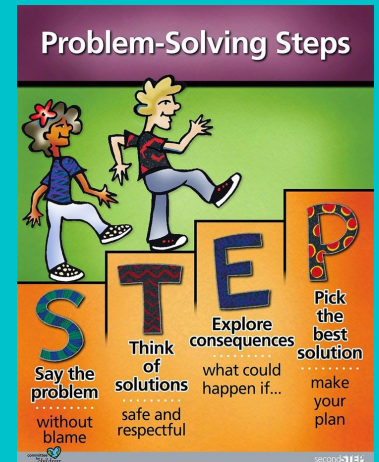
- Recalling multiplication facts

SPORT

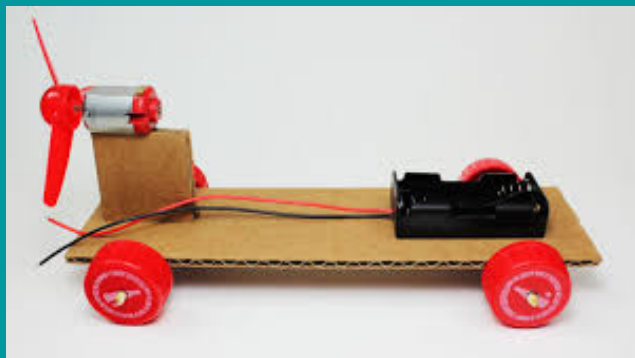


Students will participate in PSSA or Home Sport on Fridays.
